31st Annual General Body Meeting

(Date: 16th August 2013)

Respected President, Trustee, Executive Members and members of MANAVLOK,

It's my pleasure to present the report of the activities conduced in the year 2012. The decisions taken in the year are implemented and its report is given below. 31st annual general body meeting was held at MANAVLOK headquarter.

- Financial and activities report was distributed to all executive members and trustees.
- 15 members were elected as executive members for the period 2012-2017.
- Dr. D. S. Lohiya has been congratulated for his selection as member of Marathwada Vikas Mandal. He has been nominated by Governor of Maharashtra.
- In the reporting year four executive committee meetings were conducted. This
 year new Trustees and Executive members were elected by the general body
 members. Among 15 executive members, Mr. Ashok Deshmukh was elected
 as president and Mr. Aniket D. Lohiya was elected as secretary of
 MANAVLOK by executive committee.
- Mr. G. G Randad is appointed as CA of our organization. Rs 25000/- was decided as an audit fee.
- Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada University gave sanction to research Centre of our MSW College.
- The general body gave sanction to budget for the year 2013-2014 which is 5,28,49,155/-
- On 18-03-2013 two old tractors with trolley, implements of tractor, one Jeep, old T.V., cameras, tape recorder, old refrigerator, old computers and parts of computer were sold of an auction.
- An Account has been opened in Marathwada Gramin Bank (at Morewadi branch) on which donations for drought prone areas are deposited.
- SWISSAID sanctioned a project to Manaswini Mahila Prakalp. The name of the project is "Gender campaign Marathwada" (phase 1)
- A proposal of 'demanding economical support for the construction of library building for social science college is submitted to "Siddhivinayak Nyas", Mumbai.

- NRHM Maharashtra has sanctioned a CBM project for 2013-2014.
- Coloring, electric work, and other repairing of training centre at headquarter was completed.
- Repairing and coloring of hostel rooms at Manaswini Mahila Prakalp (MMP) was completed, Rs. 81,125/- was spent on it.

2) MANAGEMENT OF INSTITUTIONS:

With the help of sections of management account, computer, store, training, vehicles, HelpAge, MMP, 7 Sub-centres (Yelda, Poos, Pisegaon, Bhavthana, Patoda, Pardhewadi, Salegaon) various programs had been organized and successfully completed. Gramin vikas sanstha is looking after Pardhewadi sub-centre.

51 workers are working in the organization. Out of that 41 are male and 10 are female.

Three workers get Rs. 1500 to 2500, 32 workers get Rs. 2500 to 5000, 14 workers get above Rs. 5000 and two workers get more than Rs. 11000/- as monthly salary.

- 45 weekly meetings were held, in which head of sections and head of subcentre participated. Three tri-monthly meetings were held with the workers.
 Four meetings were conducted with executive members.
- Dr. D. S. Lohiya guided workers for better management and program implementations.

3)Self Help Groups Of Krushak Panchayat:

Economical support of Rs. 57,67,107/- was given to 1440 members for 127 self help groups from 47 villages for seed and fertilizers. Last year's recovery was collected which is 99.85%.

 Krushak Mandal (NABARD): Krushak mandal was started in 11 villages under NABARD with the initiative of MANAVLOK. Gathering of Krushi was arranged by Krushi Mandal at Bardapur. Guidance for loan was given in that gathering. Workshop was held on "agreement market" at MANAVLOK Headquarter.

4) Manaswini Mahila Prakalp (MMP):

Under this project, activities like shelter home, free legal aid, a kinder garten, girl's hostel and home science college are undertaken. Prof. Dr. Arundhati Patil has accepted responsibility to run these projects. In the reporting period, seven women lived in shelter home. 108 cases are registered in this year, out of which there was compromise in 58 cases, one case was registered in Ambajogai Police Station, 16 cases were transferred to court, and our social worker intervened in 26 cases to bring about compromise.

 Thirty nine girls stayed in girl's hostel. They paid hostel charges. Savitri mahila udyog provided meals to girls in hostel at a concessional rate.

- Two workshops on gender equality, one workshop on law for women were conducted. Selected workers from 6 villages were given training on law for women and prohibition.
- One day workshop was also organized for ASHA workers.
- A kinder garten training course is run in Manaswini which is affiliated to Open University. 14 girls completed this course.

5) Skills Training:

- 5.1) Eklavya training centre at Salegaon is being run for last 20 years, this year 10 girls took benefit of Sewing classes.
- 5.2) **College Of Social Science:** This college is being run for last 11 years. It is a two year course after graduation. 40 students got admission for this course last year. This course is affiliated to Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar University. This year 275 students applied for this course but we selected only 40 students. This is the best college in the region. Apart from this course many other social activities have been conducted. There is a good deal of the Govt. sector for the students who complete this course. Apart from curricular, our college conducts extra activities.

College staff runs a project called "Parivartan project at village Satephal (parivartan= change)". To run this project college staff pays from their salary. The key aim to run this project is to bring about socio economic change in the village. This is an experiment for integrated development of the village.

6) JANSAHYOG (for Peoples co-operation and help):

- Advocacy Centre started six years ago at Ambajogai. It aims to create
 awareness among people about their rights. It helps common people to
 understand their strength and helps poor people to take initiative for bettering
 their life. Jansahyog, consistently takes effort's to get Govt. schemes meant
 for poor communities.
- If there is any problem in getting govt. Schemes it is overcome with the help of rallies and **satyagrah**. Due to pressure created by satyagrah on revenue office Mr. Rahul Patil (Tahsildar) accepted our demands and gave in writing that the beneficiaries of the various schemes will be benefitted immediately.
- Dr. D. S. Lohiya, Dr. Arundhati Patil, Mr. Ankush Kaldate, Mr. Shyam Sarvade participated in morcha (Demonstration) with 7000 people last year. This action gave benefit to destitute, old people and handicapped.
- Kerosene was available in the black market, black marketers were making double the money they should make, and this black marketing of kerosene was stopped. The kerosene hawker who was selling in black market was forced to sell it to beneficiaries. The cost recovered out of selling of kerosene Rs. 928/- was given to a voluntary organization "Infant India". In this year the

- sellers of kerosene in the black market were caught twice and the money collected out of that Rs. 1000/- was given to physically handicapped student Prakash Sahebrao Shinde (Murud).Rs. 800/- was given to a heart patient Mr. Shaikh Ruksana Shaikh Mujahit.
- Due to our efforts twelve widows received Rs. 10000/- each under the scheme "Family economic help". 394 women and men applied for "Shravan Bal Yojna' and "Sanjay Gandhi Yojna". 47 ration cards to APL and 584 ration cards to BPL were distributed by revenue department due to our pressure. Apart from that, 22 old ration cards were renewed. 250 applications to get various Govt. Schemes were submitted to Tahsil (revenue office at Ambajogai).
- The fair price shopkeepers were not distributing food grains to beneficiaries.
 Due to our pressure they started distributing food grains to ration card holders.
 - Our team visited Govt. godown and collected the information about the food storage in the godown.
- Molkarin Sanghtana (An organization of poor women working as housemaids): As mentioned in the last report, 1034 molkarin have registered their names as member of the organization. We celebrate1st May as International Workers Day. This year a labor leader Mr. Rajkumar Ghayal (Beed) was called to preside over the program, Dr. D.S. Lohiya also addressed the gathering. 616 women workers are insured under Govt. schemes. 64 male and female workers working in the field of construction are also insured under the scheme.

7) Training centre:

MANAVLOK is a DRO for Beed District. It gives training to workers involved in watershed development program. Through watershed development Program centre, 23 Trainees were given training for PRA. The trainees were WDT WC members. Our centre at Ambajogai is also utilized by other Organizations like MAWIM, agriculture department, MMP, MSEB and NRHM. The Baliraja Grahak Bhandar also used our centre to impart one day Training on seed and fertilizer. IFFCO co-operative gave financial support for this workshop.

8) Health Department:

- **DOT:** 14 patients completed the course of Medicine for TB, 43 patients referred for the sputum check-up, 3 patients died, 27 patients took regular medicine. 16 new patients are registered.
- ASHA Sanghatna (an organization of the women working at village level as health workers): As mentioned in the last report, MANAVLOK has formed

ASHA sanghatana. To solve their problems three meetings were conducted and their salary problems were also solved.

CBM (Community Base Program):

This is a part of NRHM program. Our organization is selected as nodel organization for district Beed. Through this the Organization conducts awareness programs in the area of 6 PHCs in the District. The main aim of the program is to create awareness in the community about NRHM and to utilize the health facilities for common people. To complete the target, MANAVLOK conducted many programs in 40 villages. Due to our efforts the attendance of the medical persons increased in PHCs and they started attending their duties regularly. This has helped pregnant women and other Patients.

On behalf of our organization a physiotherapy centre is run at JANSAHYOG office. Nine old people are treated.

Our five social workers helped health department for pulse polio checkup and verification.

9) Drought Relief Program:

This year Beed District faced severe drought Ashti, Patoda, and three other Tahsils from District Beed have suffered drought. MANAVLOK conducted survey of 20 villages in Tahsil Ashti. In that survey, 40 students from our social work college were involved. Drinking water fodder for Animals and wages to laborers were acute problems. To help the needy people Govt. started programs but these programs were not sufficient to fulfill the need of people.

MANAVLOK requested and collected donations and utilized it for roof water harvesting, and pipe line for drinking water. Food grains also were collected from Ambajogai which was distributed to the farmers who were living in cattle camps.

Sakal- newspaper collected fund which was utilized in village Matori. In Matori we implemented two activities that is construction and renovation of old well. We also dug pits in the Streams which gave very good results. Now in all these villages due to roof water harvesting and watershed program, water level has increased. Therefore people are very happy.

10) HelpAge India:

- Help to 18 older people for eye operation.
- Health check-up for HelpAge people.
- Distribution of food grains etc. to 30 HelpAge People.
- International HeplAge day was celebrated on 1stOctober. Tahsil officer Mr. Rahul Jadhav, president of rotary club Mr. Thorat, Mr. Joshi, Dr. D. S. Lohiya. Mr. Aniket Lohiya, Principal and Staff of Social Science

- College, members of MANAVLOK, and 600 other people attended the program.
- Mr. Sadashiv Malwad participated in Distress Prohibition workshop held at Mumbai He also went to Rajguru Nagar for Training of Self Help Group.

11) Child-Line:

- MANAVLOK is appointed as a District Nodel NGO for Child-line India Foundation, Mumbai.
- Yuva Gram is implementing the program, which is supervised by MANAVLOK.
- To support Child-line program discussion was held with Collector Mr.
 Kendrekar and SP. The information about child-line was also given to labor officer and teachers in some schools.
- Identity cards with Signature of SP are distributed to team members.
- Rally of labor children was taken out in the city Beed. A child-line poster as a gift was given to District judge and he was also given information.

12) Agriculture Development Section:

A crop of soyabean and other pulses is grown in our agriculture land. Borewell was not working, therefore its pipeline was taken out. A new borewell was dug. Its water is used only for domestic purpose. The agriculture land at Bhavthana is looked after by a farmer. He paid some amount to organization as a rent of land.

13) Processing Units:

At our sub-centre Salegaon (District Osmanabad) a processing centre for oil, flour, pulses and chilli powder is run. This processing centre's annual income is Rs. 36830/-

14) Purchasing:

Vehicles, computers, printer-toner, materials required for other departments were purchased. Total expenditure Rs 10,33,703/- was booked on this.

15) Vehicles:

- There were 11 vehicles in MANAVLOK. Out of that eight were fourwheelers, three were two-wheelers, and out of this 6 vehicles were sold at an auction. Five new vehicles are purchased, now 10 vehicles are at the headquarter, and one four-wheeler and one motor cycle at Subcentre Salegaon.
- Rs. 3,18.281/- are spent on purchase of petrol and diesel where as Rs. 64,799/- were spent on repairing of vehicles. The rentrecieved from vehicles has been Rs. 1,55,960/-.
- A new two wheeler Pleasure, four wheeler Vista, Nano car, Grandy were purchased to run the day to day activities.

16) Construction:

- Sliding windows were fixed at training centre of Head-quarter, also the work of coloring, electric and other repairing was completed.
- Wire fencing, coloring the rooms, doors of toilet and bathrooms at Pardhewadi.
- 738 pots of toilet were sold at Ambajogai and Kaij through RCM and Rs5640/- were collected from it.

17) Vardhapan Din (Birthday of Organization):

1st April is celebrated as Vardhapan Din of the organization. For this, chief guest of the program was Prof. Mukundraj Pankhe and Prof. Bhagwanrao Shinde. On this occasion, 14 workers donate blood. Mr. Maruti Mahadevrao Kharatwas awarded by "MANAVLOK SHRI" .Matrusmruti and Pitrusmruti award were given to the brilliant Students of Home Science college and Manavlok Social Science College. All the members and workers of MANAVLOK attend this Program.

18) Associate Institution:

Sub-Centre Pardhewadi is given to Vichardhara Sanstha to run its day-to-day activity. This institution was founded by the implementation of MANAVLOK. Bhoomikanya sanstha was also started and associated by MANAVLOK.
