Manavlok has implemented “Galmukta Dharan, Galmukta Shivar” in villages and has been using the silt to improve the small pieces of farms in the village

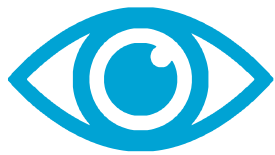

### **Background**

Ambajogai town and surrounding villages in Beed district in Marathwada is a drought prone and underdeveloped area like the rest of Marathwada. Manavlok ( Marathwada Navnirman Lokayat) was founded in 1982, as a social development organisation with the objective of improving the conditions of small farmers, landless families, farm labour and women. The founders strongly believed in constructive development work with people's participation in decision making and implementing the development programmes. The intervention began with 10 villages and currently Manavlok works with 180 villages covering all blocks of Beed district and few blocks of Latur and Osmanabad districts. The farmers along with the Manavlok team aims to realize Mahatma Gandhi's dream of "Gramswarajya". Their efforts are focused on creating livelihood opportunities in villages, improving farming by using technology, efficient use of water resources and preventing seasonal migration from villages to work in sugar factories for a few months.



### **Theory of change**

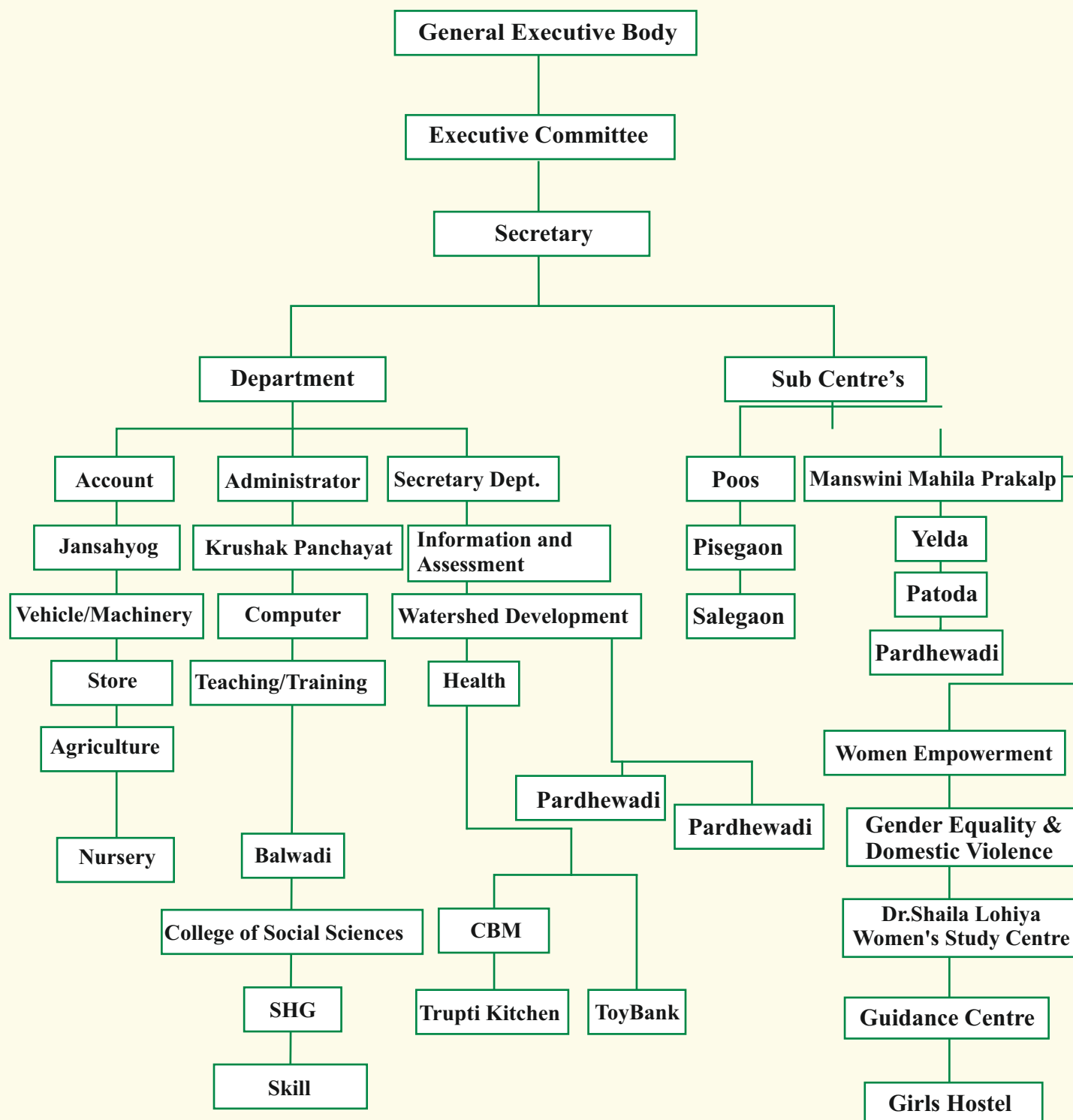
Manavlok believes in development with people's participation. It is important to understand that majority of problems faced by villagers are often interlinked. People from all sections of the village need to come together to find a solution for their problems. Manavlok interventions aim to provide financial stability to small farmers, agricultural labourers and women. Manavlok believes in respecting and creating value for physical labour. While implementing the programs in villages Manavlok team is watchful that the number of landless and poor farmer is not increasing. Effective use of science and technology in reaching the goals is important part of Manavlok's strategy. Manavlok perceives Technology and Science as important resource for rural development.

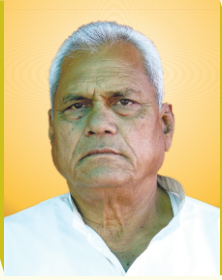

## 1. Annual General Meeting 2018



The 37th Annual General Body Meeting of the organisation was held on 14th September 2019 under the chairmanship of Shri Ashokraoji Deshmukh, honorary president of Manavlok. 37 members were present for the meeting.

The meeting began with paying tribute to Dr. Dwarkadas Lohiya (Babuji), the founder of Manavlok and Shri. Kiran Damoshan, member, governing board by

observing two minutes of silence.

Shri. Aniket Lohiya, Secretary of Manavlok welcomed the members present for the meeting.

Shri Lalasaheb Aagale, Joint Secretary of the organisation presented the minutes of the previous AGM and the report of the organisation. After some discussion the committee unanimously approved the same. Aniket Lohiya presented the financial report of the organisation as well as progress of important projects of Manavlok. He talked about the participation of Manavlok in Water Cup competition organised by Paani Foundation. He briefed the audience on implementation of Navnirman project and “Watershed development” programme. He shared details of progress made in all the projects implemented by Manavlok. The report was unanimously approved after some discussion.

The internal auditor of Manavlok Shri Amit Randad, CA presented the audited financial report of the organisation for the period from 1st April 2018 to 31st March 2019. The committee members approved the report after making some changes.

Manavlok owns 7 gunta NA land in Mandi Bazar, Ambajogai. This land is located on the banks of Jayavanti river and hence the organisation will not be able to implement its projects at this location. The information of this land is available with the charity commissioner Beed office and it is documented in an extra one. The committee decided that the organisation will officially seek permission to sell this land and will sell the land after permission.

The members present for AGM discussed about giving the right to Aniket Lohiya to take decisions about day to day activities of Manavlok, taking up new

projects, appointments of new staff, skilled and professional staff members, their honorarium and increments. The committee unanimously approved this.

The Beed district faced drought like situation in the year 2019. The committee decided that Secretary of the organisation will take decisions about supporting education of children from drought affected area and providing financial support to Youth from drought affected area, who have migrated to other areas for the purpose of education. The members also discussed about creating business groups of farmers and providing financial support to these groups for example the organisation has provided support to farmers groups from Paraskheda and Hartola by lending the tools and equipment at very low cost. After some discussion the committee unanimously approved this program.



The committee decided to give all rights to Shri Chintaman Kulkarni for supervision and repairs and maintenance of sub centre at Pawdewadi in AUSA block. The committee decided to take legal action if required. It was decided to measure the land of Manaswini Mahila Prakash and decide the value of the land. The committee approved that Shri Ashokrao Deshmukh and Shri Aniket Lohiya will discuss and take decision regarding the same.

It was decided to do performance appraisal of all staff in Administration and Accounts department and depending on the results of appraisal action should be taken to discontinue employees who are not good at work and appoint new staff, with reasonable salary. The committee unanimously gave all rights regarding this to Aniket Lohiya.

Manavlok is implementing Aqua dam project of UNICEF in 45 villages in Latur district, under the guidance of UNICEF. Manavlok has submitted proposal to The Nature Conservancy and Jankidevi Bajaj Foundation and is waiting for approval. Manavlok will implement the project after approval.

Shri Balasaheb Agale suggested that rules and SOP have to be developed about the project implementation, use of financial resources and vehicles for the period from 1st April 2019 to 31st March 2020 for the community-based planning and monitoring health project of Manavlok. The committee unanimously decided to work on SOPs and rules for the same.

For many years Manavlok has provided financial support to farmers to purchase tools and equipment. A few of them have not paid all dues. Additionally there is material and equipment which can not be used or repaired. The members discussed this issue and decided to remove the names of people who have not paid, and consider all money recovered. The committee also approved the sale of old material and equipment at reasonable price.

The members present, unanimously proposed to onboard Ms. Anjali Sudhakar as a member of governing board in place of Shri Kiran Damoshan. It was decided to make application for approval of her onboarding to the office of the charity commissioner Beed.

The members present approved the onboarding of new members in the managing committee.

## 02. General Administration

On 23rd November 2019 the first death anniversary of Dr Dwarkadas Lohiya (babuji) was observed at Manavlok. The organisation has its central office in Ambajogai and has field offices in villages. It has administrative/office based staff as well as field level staff.

During the reporting period 14 new workers joined the organisation and 19 workers resigned. During 2019-20, there were 66 staff members in Manavlok head office.

The organisation regularly conducts meetings to facilitate internal communication. 30 weekly meetings, 10 monthly meetings and 4 quarterly meetings were organised at head office, Patoda sub centre and Salegao sub centre. In addition, whenever required, meetings of the heads of various departments and units were organised.



## 2. Organization Management



Manavlok team was deployed to provide relief to the flood affected areas in Sangli district. Manavlok distributed grocery kits in Sangli. The saplings from Manavlok nursery were supplied to the Army centre at Aurangabad. Shri. Kiran Damoshan member of managing committee, expired on 6th September 2019. 280 Village Panchayat Sarpanchs, directly elected by people, in villages covered under Manavlok projects,

attended 3 day training program organised by YASHADA, Pune at Manavlok campus.

Manavlok provides accidental insurance to 17 staff members and medical insurance to 99 staff members. In addition Manavlok has group insurance policy for its staff. Manavlok provides financial support up to Rs.50000/- for medical emergency of staff member or family member of staff. Manavlok also has provision to pay gratuity when the person retires from work.

Manavlok offices had Diwali holiday between 25<sup>th</sup> to 31<sup>st</sup> October 2019.

## 03. Drought Relief Programme.

### 03- 1 Navnirman project (Integrated water resource management program supported by L and T Financial Services)

This project focused on watershed development in 20 villages in Ambajogai and Parali block in Beed and implementing the preventive measures to deal with draught like situation . L & T Financial Services supported this project for three years from 2017 to 2020.

In the year 2019-20 the program focused on Water Conservation, Soil Conservation, Organic farming, Use of water efficient devices, and creating awareness among school students and village panchayat on watershed development as this was the last year year of the program the social audit of work done during last three years was conducted.

Awareness programmes were conducted in 20 villages. The program focused on “fodder development with hydroponics technique” and Organic farming with “vermi compost”.

Apart from awareness program village volunteers motivates farmers to carry out vermi compost demo's in convergence with Krushi Vidnyan Kendra, Dighol Amba, Ambajogai. Totally 1303 farmers attended these awareness programs Ambajogai. Totally 1303 farmers attended these awareness programs.

The awareness program for students and Gram Panchayat on watershed development was conducted in 20 villages. As part of this program the students and Gram Panchayat members were provided training to maintain and repair the models created under Navnirman Project.

Water efficient devices: The Marginal farmers ( small land holder farmers), who had enough water for Rabbi season were provided financial support of Rs 15000/- each to buy sprinkler set. Five farmers from each of the 20 villages ( total 100 farmers) were the beneficiaries of this programme.

Under Navnirman project, 525 fruit saplings were distributed among 35 farmers. These farmers are small land holders have enough water to maintain the trees.

Exposure visit for farmers from the 20 villages was arranged to Baramati, Kaneri Math and Kolhapur in two batches. The farmers got first hand experience to see various experiments and demonstration projects related to farming practices.

The office staff and Village Volunteers (Krishidoots) in this project visited the project of partner organisation on climate change, implemented in three villages bujurgavadi, Nitur and Musheerabad in Nilanga block.

The third party Social Impact Analysis was done by “ Think Through Consultancy” in the month of November 2020. The “white paper” of the same was prepared.

Under this Navnirman program for the purpose of water conservation and soil conservation the activities of Stone bunding, Composite Gambian, Deep Continuous Contour Trenches, Loose boulder structure building, Desilting of Dam, Nala widening and deepening, Earthen Nala Bunding were undertaken in villages under the project.

To create awareness about organic farming 201 Shivansh demo's were constructed in 20 villages.

As a result of effective implementation of Navnirman project, specially the work done for watershed development , Mamdapur village in Parali won the 3rd prize at Taluka level in the “ Water Cup Competition” organised by The Paani Foundation.

### 03-2 Organic Farming– Shivansh compost and vermi compost demo in convergence with KVK

Shivansh compost is produced using 100% organic method. This compost is ready to use in 18 days. It is observed that the farm production increases by 15 to 40% with the use of this compost. 201 demos of preparing Shivansh compost at 20 villages in ambajogai and parli blocks in beed were successfully completed . Manavlok team with the help of Krishi Vidnyan Kendra Dighol Amba, prepared vermi compost demo in same villages, The KVK provided financial support and guidance to twenty farmers.

### 03-3 “Asha Ki Bunde”- UNICEF project

This project is being implemented in 45 villages in 5 blocks from Latur district. This project is implemented collectively by three organisations namely Bridgestone India, UNICEF- aquadam, and Manavlok.

The objective of this project is to strengthen the village level organisations for sustainability and ensuring availability of safe drinking water in the villages.

This is a pilot project implemented in five villages in Ahmadpur block of Latur district. The project will be implemented in 40 villages in Renapur AUSA, Chakur and Malanga blocks in Latur districts.

These are the villages generally face severe water shortage. In this project the primary responsibility of Manavlok is to conduct meetings with village panchayats, to strengthen the village level water, sanitation and health committee (wash committee) and collect necessary information for effective implementation of this project. Manavlok regularly updates all the activities to Aqua Dam Pune.

As part of scale up of this initiative the selection and training of village level workers, meetings with village level workers, capacity building, preparation of plan of implementation was done. The team measured and documented water level of few selected Wells in the villages every month.

In February and March 2019 the Water quality from 40 scale up villages was evaluated, Mainly the proportion of fluoride, nitrate and H<sub>2</sub>S was tested. The villagers were informed about the quality of drinking water.



### 03-4 Desilting of Old Wells



• With the support from Caring Friends, Manavlok helped the farmers to remove silt from 45 old Wells. With support from CCIL (Clearing corporation of india limited) 109 selected farmers were provided sprinkler sets.

As a result of good Monsoon the water level in the wells increased and there was sufficient water for drinking for cattle. The sprinklers were useful for kharif crop.

### 03-5 “Galmukt Dharan, Galyukt Shivar” Program

The government had appointed Manavlok to implement its ambitious project in Beed district. Under this program, in 6 blocks of Beed district Silt from 17 dams was desilted with 28 9569 tractor trips and 51612 hiva trips. Total silt removed was 1533361.2 Cubic meter and was poured/spread on the farmlands of 1378 farmers. This helped in improving the quality of the farmland and increase in the agriculture production. The farmers also saved money with the silt application as they require spend lot of money on purchasing chemical fertilizers every year.

### 03-6 “Machine support for Satyamev Jayate Water Cup competition 2019”

Manavlok had supported 75 villages from Beed and Latur district for Watershed Development. This included construction of Deep continuous contour trenches (DCCTs) on 342.50 Hectors, Nala Widening and Deepening (DOHA/NDW) of 47.55 kilo metre, Compartment Bunding (CB) on 715 Hector, Water Accumulating Deep Trenches (WADTs) 1579 Nos. Earthen Nala bunding (ENB) 42, Farm Ponds 40 Nos. Total 1266801.05 cubic metre work was undertaken and to complete all this work the JCB and pocklain was used for 14766.50 hours. in addition to this, 24189 saplings from Manavlok nursery were distributed in 54 villages.

### 03-7 Manavlok Nursery

There are four nurseries of the organisation located at Patoda(M), Bhavthana, Ambajogai and Pisegaon.



14400 saplings from Bhavthana and Pisegaon nursery were sent to Aurangabad from Poos (sub center) nursery 190 saplings were sold for rupees 3800/-

The nursery has Tamarind, palas, Aapta, Pimpal, kavat, Bel, Karanj, Arjuna, Jungli badam, Gulmohar, Shevga, Saptaparni, Bibava, Anjan, Bhali, Katori Ruti, Sisam, Sankeshwar and custard apple saplings.



### **03-8 Detailed Project Report (DPR) under Bajaj CSR support:**

Manavlok Ambajogai in collaboration with Jankidevi Bajaj Rural development Trust Pune decided to implement integrated watershed development programme in 8 villages from Parali and Dharur blocks. The project began with participatory rural appraisal (PRA). The socio economic survey work was conducted in 8 villages during 28 November to 5th December 2019. Shri Sopan Pol monitored the implementation of PRA process. At the same time the ground water level in these villages was measured. The team also collected information from the Tahsil office regarding previous year monsoon and the list of villages supplied water through tanker



For the purpose of making DPR, information booklet about farming and livelihoods was collected from Agriculture Department Ambajogai.

### **03-9 Considering climate flexibility and efficient use of water in cotton crop Project supported by The nature Conservancy (TNC)**

This project was approved by The Nature Conservancy India, New Delhi. The world is facing the impact of climate change. It is seen that farming and rural life is affected the most and the farmer suicide it is one of the effects of climate change. Many researchers and scholars are of the opinion that Marathwada is turning into a desert and long term and sustainable measures are required to be implemented urgently to prevent this. As part of this effort the Cotton crop project is implemented with The Nature Conservancy Delhi. This is a pilot project and will be implemented in five villages namely Pathan, Mandwa, Mamdapur, Bodhegaon and Moha. The long-term objective of this project is Conservation of nature and Management of water resource.



During reporting period major activities conducted in the project area are plantation of 1500 trees, 5 units of vermicompost, educational tour of 39 farmers, 10 community meetings, 10 community awareness programs, 2 capacity building workshop for five workers and a training program for village level organisations where 49 participants were present.

The details of financial support provided by Manavlok to members of farmers groups during kharip and rabbi season of 2019 for the purpose of purchasing seeds and fertilizers, agriculture related side business and equipment.

## 04-1 Providing Health Services/Educational support/ Financial support/ Disaster relief

Manavlok had provided hemodialysis machine to Dialysis department at the Swami Ramananda Tirtha Government Rural Medical College and Hospital, Ambajogai. The needy and poor patients will be able to save their ongoing expenses. 27 patients took benefit of this machine for their treatment. The total number of cycles done with the machine in reporting period is 1093. By making use of this machine the patients saved INR 21,86,000/-

Manavlok provided sonography machine to the Swami Ramananda Tirtha Government Rural Medical College and Hospital Ambajogai. The total number of patients benefited is 25035.

The amount saved by the total number of patients on sonography is INR 1, 25, 17, 500/-

Manavlok provided financial support of INR 20,000/- to two patients for treatment of critical illness.

Manavlok has created a facility for providing Walkers, bed, other equipment required by patients. The necessary equipment is provided on very minimal rent. The patients return the item after the need is over.

## 05 Manaswini Mahila Prakalpa ( women's empowerment project)

The project focuses on four areas

- 1- Awareness about gender equality
- 2- Skill/livelihood development
- 3- Counselling and legal aid
- 4- Women's health

This project AIMS at creating awareness about Gender equality and preventing gender based violence in the family and community. As part of gender awareness the Youth from 20 villages from Manavlok project villages attended the camp in Anandvan in Varora.

Dr Arundhati Patil the project coordinator attended a meeting at Latur organised by Swiss Aid to discuss a new projects.

Under the skill development and livelihood program 139 women from project villages received skill training in paper bag, jute bag, cloth bag making as well as for setting up agriculture based small production units and training in entrepreneurship.

A conference on “Women’s Right to Health” was organised at Samata Pratishthan Beed. The issue of removal of uterus by women labour in sugarcane industry to get work opportunity was discussed. Participants shared their views and experiences on this matter. Balaji Waghmare and Harsha were present for this meeting. A workshop on counselling was organised for women from the families where the man in farmer family has committed suicide. 18 women from farmers suicide affected families attended this workshop. Dr. Milind Potdar, Psychiatrist from Latur facilitated the workshop.





Swiss Aid, a Donor agency had organised a meeting of representations of the organisations working on the issue of “Violence against women in the family”. This meeting was organised at Panchgani and Harsha represented Manavlok in this meeting. On 24th July 2018 to mark the sixth death anniversary of Dr Shaila Lohiya, family counselling centre was inaugurated in village Dharur. On this occasion the P I of Dharur Police station Shri Kedarnath Palve, Nagar- Adhyaksh Shri. Swaroopsingh Hazare, Shri. Suryakant Jagtap, reporter, Shri. Sunil Gavli, Shri Lalasaheb Agale, joint secretary of Manavlok, Dr. Prakash Jadhav, Advocate Jaysingh Chauhan,



were present for this inauguration. In the evening a music program “Pause Gani” was Performed by Shri Mahesh Patil, famous TV singer and his group. Shri Atul Kulkarni did the comparing.

A study tour of single women was taken to Pratham skill centre at Aurangabad .The women were provided information about courses like Hotel Management, Beauty parlour. After the institute visit, the women went for sight seeing to the world famous Ellora Caves. The Sajag gram Samiti and Single women's group together did a study tour in bhandgaon village, Taluka Daund Ahmednagar. They visited Snehalya and Maharashtra Small Industries Development Corporations “Paithani Saree weaving centre” and Agriculture Technology Training centre. The group also visited a Spices factory at Bhandgaon managed by Women's group under the leadership from Kamlabai Paradesi.

Shri Sunil Chikhale, social activist/Insurance advisor distributed goats to 18 needy and deserving women so that they can earn livelihood. The project coordinator Dr Arundhati Patil was present on this occasion.



Sajag Gram Samiti organised a Two-day workshop on “Women's legal rights”. The dignitaries and resource persons who provided guidance to the participants included The district magistrate Shri Subramanyam Swami, Advocate shri. Ashok Kulkarni, Dr. Mangesh Sir Parbhani and Dr Vrushali Kinnarkar Parbhani.

The Manaswini Mahila Prkalpa in collaboration with Legal Aid centre organised awareness session about legal rights. The district magistrate Sarpatnikar madam from Ambajogai Court and

other judges and lawyers were present for this workshop. The men and women activists working on gender related issues attended this workshop.

As a response to the rape case of Priyanka Reddy at Hyderabad the citizens of Ambajogai City came together and formed a group 'Sajag Ambajogaikar' ('Aware citizens of Ambajogai'). This group approached the schools in Ambajogai and Dharur blocks and organised awareness sessions for adolescent students. They talked about sexuality ,menstruation, Self-defence and understanding good touch and bad touch. In 12 schools they covered 1753 girls and 1207 boys through this initiative.

The Youth from villages under Manavlok, attended Camps at Anandvan. The Stepping-stone camps were attended by 57 boys and 87 girls ( total 144) In addition to the ongoing activities Manasvini Mahila Prkalpa organised few events such as Meetings with self-help group, Awareness program to promote reading, “Youth for equality”, birth anniversary of Savitribai Phule, Makar Sankranti etc.





The project organised a get together for newly married women. This is called “Maher Melava” The purpose of this event is to connect the newly married girls with the organisation. 56 newly married women attended this get together. The awareness workshops on laws related to women, skill development, gender equality, health awareness were attended by 539 women from different villages. The project provided ration kits to 20 needy women. New water storage tanks to store safe drinking water were provided to 30 women. In 25 villages the project donated 200 liters capacity water tanks for public use. 35 water tanks were provided for storing drinking water for cattle.

## 06- “Jansahyog” (Unit for participatory development)

Accessing the benefits of government schemes is a difficult task for the underprivileged and needy villager. They need support and assistance to avail the benefits of government schemes. Most of the schemes are underutilized due to lack of information, assistance and guidance to the eligible persons or family. Similarly acquiring certificates and documents is also difficult task for people from disadvantaged background.

Manavlok has a separate unit that works with the purpose of enabling the families or individuals below poverty line to take benefit of government schemes. This unit assists the individuals and families to fill the application forms, access the necessary documents and certificates and to do follow up with the government departments.

This unit sent across 13 request letters to various departments in government offices, and for various certificates. The unit was successful in getting 533 certificates for eligible people.

Under Sanjay Gandhi Niradhar Yojana, 192 applications were made, out of which 65 were approved.

Under the “National family financial support” scheme 26 applications were submitted and 9 were approved.

Applications were made by 95 above poverty line families for ration card and 42 two families got ration card similarly 47 families below poverty line made application for ration card and 13 were approved. Application for change of ration card word made for 12 families and 4 got approval.

Connection for cooking gas to families- Manavlok had provided financial support to XX families for gas connection. INR 143923 were recovered from XX families.

Manavlok collected INR 5493000/- from 50 individual donors from Ambajogai city. During the reporting period 787 ration kits (One month ration for senior citizens) were distributed to poor and needy families. On 23rd January 2020, with support from “Caring friends” a one- day outing for women working as housemaids to Tuljapur and Pandharpur was organised. 40 women working as housemaids along with six staff members went for this outing.

With the corporation from the beed district co op bank and Vasundhara co op bank the government aid of INR 23 6400/- was home delivered to 124 differently able beneficiaries.

Aniket Lohiya secretary Manavlok discussed with the Tahasildar, the issue of starting fodder camp at Mudegaon.

This unit sent across 13 request letters to various departments in government offices, and for various certificates. The unit was successful in getting 533 certificates for eligible people.

Under Sanjay Gandhi Niradhar Yojana, 192 applications were made, out of which 65 were approved.

Under the “National family financial support” scheme 26 applications were submitted and 9 were approved.

Applications were made by 95 above poverty line families for ration card and 42 two families got ration card similarly 47 families below poverty line made application for ration card and 13 were approved. Application for change of ration card word made for 12 families and 4 got approval.



## 07- Health projects

### Community based monitoring and planning of Health Services

Beed district the “Community based planning and monitoring of Health Services” is implemented across 120 villages with corporation from the health department. Two block level planning and monitoring committee meetings were organised during the reporting period. The chief of Panchayat Samiti was present for these meetings. 28 committee members attended and participated in meetings.

The training programs on WASH topics (village health nutrition water supply and sanitation) were organised. 340 people attended these trainings in 27 groups.



### **Health awareness programmes**

Manavlok conducted 56 health awareness programmes in different villages where 1719 people were present.

One program to facilitate interaction between Primary Health Centre staff and people was organised.

Conducting Social Audit of Patients Welfare Fund of the Primary Health Centre





Information about five health improvement centres was collected with the help of a questionnaire. 92 committee members were present during this social audit. The committee members consisted of village representative, Grampanchayat, Panchayat samiti, Taluka health officer, Medical officer, Community health officer and other stakeholder. The social audit of Dhanora rural Hospital was also done where 6 committee members were present. Information was collected with the help of a questionnaire. Decentralized participatory planning program was implemented in 8 villages where 398 villages participated.

## 07-1 Workshops with “Adolescent Girls”

Capacity building workshops for adolescent girls were conducted in the schools of 4 villages. Ms Sunita Gandhi, experienced personality development trainer, facilitated these workshops. Total 159 girls students from 4 village schools attended the workshops/ The workshops focused on personality development and life skill education.

Dr Archana Thorat, gynaecologist from Ambajogai is always interested in awareness programmes for girls and women. She conducted awareness sessions in 11 ZP schools and 11 private schools. The girls from ZP schools from Bharaj, Pokhri, Varavati, Dighol Amba, Devla, Bhavthana, Chinchkhandi, Kumbef, Hivara and Ambajogai attended the workshop. Each session was attended by 10-12 adolescent girls and their mother or sister along with them. Similarly in private schools the girl students attended the session along with either mother or sister. The purpose of the session was to

create awareness about important health and nutrition subjects among girls and family members. Topics such as anaemia, balanced diet, communicable diseases and cancer were discussed in the session. Total 767 adolescent girls attended these workshops.



### Awareness workshops for women

A workshop on physical and emotional /psychological changes in the life cycle of women was conducted at Ambejogai. 194 women participated in this workshop.





## 07-2 Decentralized participatory planning of public services

This is an Innovative and new program of Manavlok. Currently this program is being implemented across 15 villages. Few important activities conducted as part of this program are

- 1- Formation of Village Development groups in 15 villages . Total members 156.
- 2- Meetings with villagers in 12 villages.
- 3- Capacity building of Village Development group members in 15 villages Total number of participants 88.
- 4- Awareness program in 12 villages 1128 villages attended the event.
- 5- Training in survey and use of data collection tools for 82 members from 11 villages Development group participated
- 6- Training in in information verification 79 participants.
- 7- Villages level discussions/ meetings in 11 villages number of participants 1245.
- 8- Block level discussion meeting 380 villagers from 20 villages attended this meeting.



To monitor the progress of this project meetings were conducted every month where elected representatives, government offices and NGO workers shared their opinion and suggestions. On 23rd October 2019 Professor Jonathan Fax from Accountability Research Centre, American University, Vincent Mujhune from Uganda , Angela and Anu Joshi from England visited Kumbefal and Radi villages. They had discussions with social audit group and he villagers during their visit Dr Nitin Jadhav and Bhau Saheb from organisation Sathi Pune were present on this occasion.

## 07-3 Project TRUPTI ( Providing meals for elderly destitute)

Community kitchens at village level are run under this program Currently this program is implemented in 24 villages and 370 senior persons ( female 227 and male 143) are availing benefit under this program. This program run through the village, beneficiary and donors funds/contribution. and other donors to provide food and other necessary provision to needy seniors. The total amount collected was 184994 rupees.

In addition to meals the seniors were provided with Walkers, walking sticks, urine pots, tiffins, commode chair, bedpans etc. as per their need. During Diwali festival packets of traditional sweets were distributed to all the beneficiaries.

It is interesting to know that all the kitchen contactors are women from the same village, who did not have assured livelihood and had the skills, capacity and desire to take up this responsibility. Manavlok has used the traditional cooking skill of women to create livelihood opportunity.

During Diwali festival 21 community kitchens were gifted with mixers and 8 kitchen contractors were provided

As a result of this program 21 women (kitchen contractors) one from each village, have assured livelihood for all 12 months.





## 08 Education /trainings /workshops/ camps

### 08-1 Dr Shaila Lohiya library and Study Centre for Women

The Study Centre was started considering the need of safe place for girl students to study and read books. It also has a library facility where the students can access books for reference. The study centre is open for women students from 7 am to 5 pm every day. At the end of July 2019, the Study Centre had 1487 books on women empowerment, home science, Stories, biographies and general knowledge etc. On an average 15 to 20 girls use this facility every day.

### 08-2 RunZun Play Group

The play group started from 17<sup>th</sup> June. Thirty children took admission in RunZun play group. Cultural festivals like Ashadhi Ekadashi, Guru Pornima, Narali Pornima were celebrated. On few occasions parents also participated in celebrations. The students were taught names of birds, animals, fruits, flowers etc. on 13<sup>th</sup> March the annual get together was organised Shri Sunil Chikhle was invited for the get together. Activity based as well as learning based competitions for children were organised. The children participated enthusiastically and enjoyed a lot.

### 08-3 Eklavya Training Centre, Salegaon

In the training centre at Salegaon, 11 girls are learning tailoring.

### 08-4 Manavlok College of Social work

The result of 4<sup>th</sup> semester exam of social work college was 92.10%. in the MSW exam conducted in March 2019, Sanjay Ashruba Khandare scored 76.80% and ranked first in college. Santosh Ramchandra Khamkar ranked second and scored 75.70% For the academic year 2019-20, the college admitted 44 students ( 11 girls and 33 boys) in first year and 38 students ( 16 girls and 22 boys) in second year.

The orientation visits of first year students were conducted during 16<sup>th</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> July. The students were accompanied by Dr. Nazir Shaikh, Dr. Rama Pande, Prof. Sukeshini Jogdand, Prof Kishan Shingare and Dr. Hanumant Salunkhe for the visits. The second year students visited Hasegaon, Budhoda, Anandwadi villages in Latur district for orientation visits.

Dr. Arundhati Patil and Dr. Nazir Shaikh accompanied the second-year students. On 17<sup>th</sup> July 2019, a get together of students, parents, teachers and office staff of MSW college was organised. On this occasion Dr. Babasaheb Kokate, adhisabha member, Dr Babasaheb Ambedkar Marathwada university and Prof of Balabhim college, Beed talked on “Indian thought process and human life” The chairperson of this program was parents representative Shri Kisanrao Pandhar.





The board member of Manavlok Shri M.V.Kakde Sir and the Principal of the college Dr. Prakash Jadhav also addressed the students. In total 42 parents attended this get together.

Dr. Rajendrasinh Rana, Jalpurush and Shri. Aniket Lohiya secretary Manavlok, addressed the MSW students on the subject “People Participation in addressing Water Issues” on 30<sup>th</sup> September 2019.

A two day workshop on “Research Methodology” was organised on 15<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> February 2020 for the PhD students and teaching staff of the social work college. Dr. Keshav Walke, Matru Seva Sangh Social Work college, Nagpur and Dr. Gopal Kulkarni, Research consultant from Pune were the resource persons for this workshop. The teaching staff of social work college along with 24 PhD students participated in this workshop.

Manavlok College of Social Work and Gandhi Research Foundation, Jalgaon jointly organised a one day workshop on the subject “social responsibility and sustainable development” for students of social work college on 4<sup>th</sup> March 2020. 74 students of social work college and 6 students from other colleges attended this workshop. Dr. John Tennadurai and Dr.Ashwin Zala from Gandhi research Foundation, Jalgaon facilitated the workshop. Aniket Lohiya, Secretary Manavlok was the chairperson.

The students, teachers and non-teaching staff members of the social work college attended the Ambajogai Youth Festival during 1<sup>st</sup> to 5<sup>th</sup> February 2020. The girls kabbadi team from social work college participated in the competition.

The rural camp of first year students was organised in Morfali, Amala, Limala, Jaitapur, Sarafraipur, Koyal, Moha and Devthana villages. The study tour was conducted for second year students. The students visited Rashtriya Seva Samiti, Tirupati, Chitor district, Andhra Pradesh and Dr. A.P.J, Abdul Kalam Foundation, Ramnathpuram, Tamilnadu and Swami Vivekanand Smarak, Kanyakumari Tamilnadu, NIMHANS, Bangalore, Karnataka as part of the study tour.

On 10<sup>th</sup> February 2020, the proposal to conduct academic audit of the social work college was sent to Dr Ambedkar Marathwada University.

The social work college published “Manavlok research Bulletin “quarterly.

**Library :** the college library has a collection of 5832 books related to social work curriculum. E library facility is also available for students. The additional documents required for proposal to construct a library was sent to Siddhi Vinayak trust, Mumbai.

### 08-5 Toy bank

In collaboration with Toy Bank, Mumbai Manavlok is implementing a project to improve quality of education in villages. The objective of this project is to increase the number of children enrolling in schools, to prevent School dropouts, to bring back the dropouts back to schools and to create interest in learning among students by using toys, games and activities. The program aims to promote Social, Educational, Emotional and Physical development of children. This program is implemented in 35 schools in Ambajogai with 4562 students enrolled . The Toy Bank program is implemented in 15 Anganwadis in villages in Ambajogai block where 1077 children are attending the Anganwadis. The Toy Bank team visited the schools and anganwadis, observed classes conducted with the use of toys, games and activities. They conducted few activities and games with students and provided guidance to teachers to conduct classes using games and activities.

## Childline

Childline is working in district Beed and “Yuvagram” from Kej is working as regional coordinator of Childline. A program “Childline se Dosti” was organised to create awareness about Childline and the facilities.

Children's day was celebrated for 1 week during this week various competitions work organised local MLA Shri Sandeep Kshirsagar was the chief guest for Prize Distribution. District health officer organised one awareness program for 600 “Asha workers” from Beed district. The program focused on issues related to children and children's rights. Monthly meetings with field level NGOs were regularly conducted for coordination and updates. Various reports were sent to Childline Delhi office. Efforts were made to solve the issues of children at various locations. General awareness about the work of Childline was also done during this period.



## 09- Farm Mechanization

Manavlok owns two Tractors and one harvester. During the reporting period 19 farmers made use of the tractor and harvester. The tractor was used for ploughing --,--,and --- -. The tractor and harvester were used to do farming on land near Manavlok office. It was also used to carry the saplings from nursery from one place to other during the reporting period from Malegaon sub centre 1 bbf machine 1 rotavator, tractor, trolley and ---- was brought to the head office.



## 09-1 Farm Improvement Project

Manavlok has given ins farm land at Bhavthana to a farmer on profit sharing basis. Manavlok received Rs 10000/- of the same.

## ● Relief work at flood affected Area from Kolhapur and Sangli

Manavlok team did relief work during 2nd August to 2nd September 2019 in flood affected villages in Kolhapur and Sangli districts.

Manavlok did relief work in 13 villages namely Bramhanal, Khatav, Vasegade, Malwadi, Chopadewadi, Sukhwadi, Padmade, Bilwadi, Digras, Borban, Narasinhavadi, Rajapur wadi and Kurundwadi. The work done included clearing the dirt and silt in village and the Zilla Parishad Schools, burring the dead animals from the villages using JCB. The JCB total hours of work were 209.



Manavlok operated a community kitchen to provide free meals for flood affected people.

From these kitchens total 22290 meals were provided during 13<sup>rd</sup> to 23<sup>rd</sup> August. This facility was to support people from Bramhanal, Padmale, Narasinhavadi, Mauje Digras and Rajapurwadi villages. Manavlok distributed Bisleri water costing INR 36580 for drinking purpose in flood affected villages.

Manavlok distributed ration kits to 1047 families from Sangli, Rajapurwadi and Sukhwadi. These kits consisted food and other necessary items, such as match box, detergent soap, hair oil, toothpaste, candles, mosquito repellent, sugar, wheat flour, lentil, poha, chilli powder, spices, groundnuts etc. The clothes like Indian daily wear, inner wears, children's clothes etc were distributed. Textbooks, notebooks, water bottles, school bag, were distributed to school students. Manavlok spent INR 11 24273/- to purchase this material. The donors from Ambajogai had collected 63,349 INR for flood relief work.

## ● Youth Festival Ambajogai 2020

Manavlok organised a “Youth Festival” in Ambajogai, during 1st to 5th February 2020. The objective of this festival was to provide a common platform for the youth from the city and surrounding villages to come together and interact with each other. During this festival various competitions including wrestling, Kabaddi volleyball, Enofest and discussion sessions were organised. Shri Dhananjay Munde, Minister Social Justice, Maharashtra State and Palak Mantri (Guardian Minister) district Beed were present for the inauguration.

The objectives of this festival were to promote physical fitness, health awareness, participation in sports among youth (male and female) from rural and semi-urban parts of Ambajogai. To provide opportunity for Education, recreation and innovation, to promote and facilitate communication and contact between Youth from different villages. The festival provided opportunities to display talents in scientific innovations and demonstrations. Motivational speeches and interactions with upcoming business persons to motivate youth were organised. For various sports competitions teams from different parts of Ambajogai (city as well as villages) participated enthusiastically.





For Kabaddi competition 58 teams of girls and boys participated, for Wrestling competition 129 women and men from different weight groups took part, 49 teams of men and women for volleyball competition and for Innova fest competition 27 men and women displayed their models based on technology farming and related activities. An interactive session “Yuvak Samvad” popular Youth icon and respected MLA Shri. Rohit Sunanda Rajendra Pawar was the attraction of the festival.
