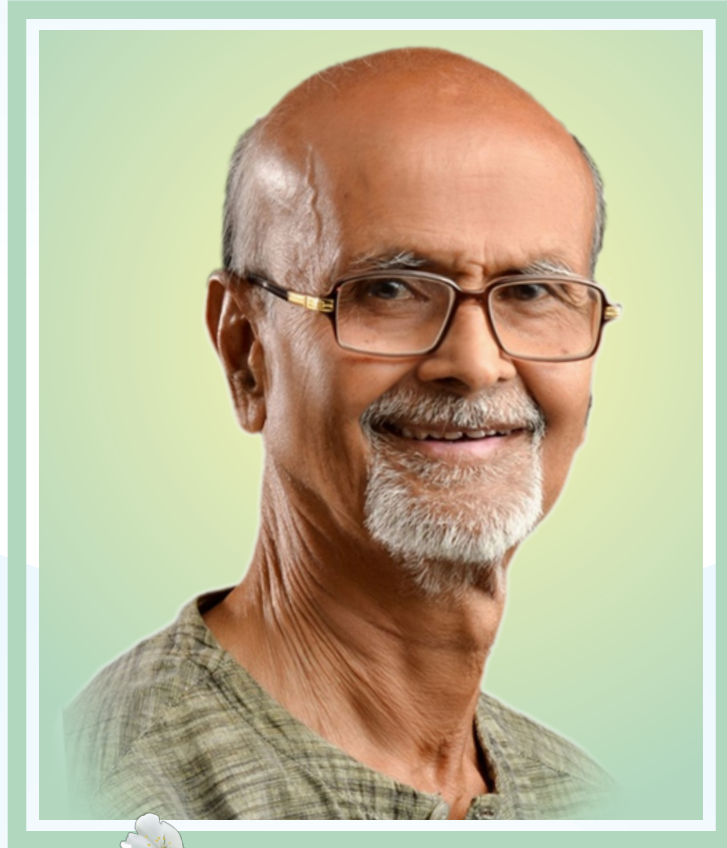



In order to achieve to equality, from collective and creative work, in the life of women, landless laborers and marginal farmers. "Marathwada Navnirman Lokayat" "Manavlok" was established in 1982. Ambajogai Taluka in Beed district, similar to other talukas in Marathwada, is drought-prone. The work initially started with ten villages, has now reached farmers from 133 villages of Ambajogai, Kaij, Majalgaon, Parli and Dharur taluka. All the villages are making efforts to achieve 'Gram Swaraj' as envisioned by Mahatma Gandhi. Across the region, economy is directly depended on agriculture. Due to lack of industrialization, other avenues have not opened up. Thus, the region is totally dependent on rainfall and farmers have no other option but to wait for monsoon. The marginal and landless, which are the most likely to be affected, migrate to sugarcane fields. The number from Beed district itself is a staggering 3.5 lakhs people every year, with at times 90% of the village migrating.

"Development from people's participation" is the foundation of Manavlok's work. Various problems of rural society are entangled into each other. To solve all these issues, Manavlok's main role is to harness local human energy and create synergy, help marginal farmers, labourers and women achieve economic stability, run various programmes to enable holistic development and giving due importance to physical activities. While achieving the objectives, it is a conscious effort to ensure that the number of landless, poor farmers do not increase. 01 Minutes of the Annual General Body meeting 2020

The 38th Annual General Body Meeting of the organisation was held on 24th October 2020 under the chairmanship of Shri Ashokraoji Deshmukh, honorary president of Manavlok. 37 members had attended the meeting. The meeting began with attendees observing two minutes of silence in memory of Late Smt. Sushilabai Govindrao Pande and late Shri Ankushrao Narayandada Kaldade. Shri Lalasaheb Aagale, Joint Secretary of the organisation presented the minutes of the previous AGM and the report of the organisation. The committee unanimously approved the same.



Shri. Aniket Lohiya, Secretary of Manavlok welcomed the members present for the meeting. He reported about the programmes implemented during the pandemic to help the poor and needy people. He said that Manavlok provided centralised oxygen suction system to Covid ward/ ICU at Swami Ramanandteerth Rural Medical college and Hospital, Ambejogai. Manavlok also provided 100 jumbo oxygen cylinders, 5 high flow nasal cannulas during the critical period in pandemic. The members unanimously approved this initiative.

The internal auditor of Manavlok Shri Amit Randad, CA presented the audited financial report of the organisation for the period from 1st April 2020 to 31st March 2021. The committee members approved the report after discussion and few changes were made to the report.

The Secretary informed that Manavlok is receiving less amount from the donors and the auditors have asked for increasing the fees/ charges. The president of Manavlok has discussed this situation with Shri. Bajrangdas Lohiya. It was decided to appoint another auditor. The rights to appoint another auditor was unanimously given to Shri. Aniket Lohiya, Secretary, Manavlok.

The committee decided to auction 8 backhoe loader machines of Mahindra company and some old equipments owned by Manavlok.

Manavlok was running a Home Science College under SNDT University. Due to less enrolment of students, the college was not operational. The Swarajya Gramin Bahu udeshiya Sanstha (rural development organisation) from Parali had approached Manavlok to handover this college to them. Shri Aniket Lohiya proposed to handover the college to this organisation. The members approved the decision to handover the home Science college to Swarajya Gramin Bahu Uddeshiya Sanstha (rural development organisation), Parali.

The members decided that there is a need to hire few more persons in Manavlok committee. It was decided to onboard new members in the managing committee.



02 Manavlok General Administration



On the occasion of Death Anniversary of Dr. Dwarkadas Lohiya, on 23rd November 2020, a programme was organised to distribute Jaipur foot to differently abled individuals. During this reporting year 5 staff members joined Manavlok and 38 staff members resigned from their job. The details of current human resources at Manavlok are mentioned in the following table

The meetings to discuss the work progress and planning for implementing projects were conducted at Manavlok central office. Thirty-seven weekly meetings, eight monthly meetings, three quarterly meetings of project staff were conducted. The trustee meetings were called four times during the year. The 38th Annual General Body meeting was also conducted.

During the pandemic Manavlok distributed grocery kits to needy families especially daily wage labour who lost their livelihood in lockdown in rural and urban areas.

Managing committee members Shri. Ankushrao Kaldate passed away on 1st October 2021 and Shri. Shrikrishna Kale passed away on 8th November 2021. Manavlok paid respect to both of them to appreciate their contribution in supporting the organisation.

Manavlok provided accidental insurance to 16 staff members and medical insurance to 101 staff members. In addition, Manavlok has group insurance policy for its staff.

03 Water and Soil conservation programmes

Extension of Navnirman Project (Drought prevention program supported by L and T Financial Services)

In the year 2019-20 the program focused on Water Conservation, Soil Conservation, Organic farming, Use of water efficient devices, and creating awareness. As a result of implementing Soil and Water Conservation techniques, through this initiative, the water level in bore well at the farm of Shri. Shivling Akerkar in XXXXX village is improved which resulted into change in the farm production and increase in profits. Shri. Shivling Akerkar was interviewed where he shared his experiences in the entire process. A



shooting of his farm was performed using drone. The shooting focused on showing the use of technological devices in the farm.

The film including the interview and farm shoot was sent to Shri Kiran Kadam, Sr. Manager, L and T financial services for information. During the extension period of the project, it was decided to install Automatic Weather stations for the benefit of farmers. The Automatic Weather Stations were installed at 4 villages in the project. (XX, YY, AA, BB) Dr. Maurya, eminent geologist visited the project area and studied the impact of the initiatives taken for improving the ground water level in villages, land capacity for retaining water as well as impact of use of water efficient devices on water and soil conservation in project area. Based on the report prepared by Dr.Maurya the L and T Financial Services prepared a “white paper” which was published in the online event. The staff and village level workers of Manavlok, representatives of L and T Financial Services, farmers from project villages attended this online programme and shared their experiences. The process of selection of beneficiaries, the responsibility of repair and maintenance of resources including devices provided under the project was discussed. At the end of the event it was decided that the Village Panchayat, along with the beneficiary farmers and the village will take this responsibility.

Use of Machines/ Devices for water and Soil conservation

Village Pangulgavhan, Ashti block and village Kanadighat and village Umrade Jahangir from Beed block, were provided with Poklen machine for water and Soil conservation work. This machine was used for 678.4 hours. These villages are participating in prosperous village competition organised by Paani Foundation. Works such as Desilting of Dam, Nala widening and deepening, Earthen Nala Bunding were undertaken in these villages using the machine. This proved beneficial for the villages. The works such as repair of pond, Nala widening and deepening, Earthen Nala Bunding was completed. In village Kanadighat and village Umrade Jahangir under the prosperous village project was measured. 32314.18 Ghana meter work is done using the machine and it has created water resource of 32.31 million litres.

03 Water and Soil conservation programmes

03-1 Revival of Pond



The programme to revive the ponds in villages in project area is implemented by Manavlok in collaboration with A T E Chandra foundation. Initially the team visited villages in Ashti block to select the ponds to be revived. On 25th March 2021, the work began in village Ruti Inamgao in presence of MLA Shri. Suresh Dhas, Member, Maharashtra State Vidhan Parishad. The expenses of removing the Silt from the ponds is performed using the project funds and the farmers are spending money for transporting the removed silt. The silt is going to improve the quality of the farm land and the expenses on chemical fertilizers will be reduced.

During the reporting period the team visited villages in Majalgaon and Vadavani blocks to select the ponds for silt removal in next stage.

03-2 Aasha Ki Boonde - UNICEF

This project is being implemented in 45 villages in 5 blocks from Latur district. This project is implemented collectively by three organisations namely Bridgestone India, UNICEF- aquadam, and Manavlok.

The objective of this project is to strengthen the village level organisations for sustainability and ensuring availability of safe drinking water in the villages.



An online training of 23 village level workers on “Jal Jeevan Mission” was organised. The training focused on providing information and skills to the village level workers. The topics such as importance of measuring the ground-water level, technique of measuring the ground water level, water economics, reviving wells and bore wells and preparing village action plans. The village workers team collected log data of wells in the village and filled in the COBO tool.

Pumping test was conducted in few villages from Renapur block (Rui Rameshvar, Dhoki, Yeli) and the reports were submitted to aquadam. Similarly, Hydrological report of villages kolwadi, Molvan, Guttewadi, Yeldarwadi, Narvatwadi were prepared and submitted to aquadam. The Aquadam donated 5000 bathing soaps which were distributed in families from 25 villages.

Nursery:

The importance of tree planting is well known, especially with the arrival of rains every year, many people plant trees, but due to the Covid outbreak in the last two seasons, it has not received enough attention. Manavlok Supported Eco Battalion, Aurangabad unit of Army for plantation. Manavlok in association with Aweg Management Services (a Delhi-based company), is helping in this to produce at least 15,000 seedlings annually.



Also Manavlok has provided the machine for 750 hours to army center, Aniket Lohiya, Secretary Manavlok visits this nursery from time to time. This support will help in tree plantation and increase green cover over hilly areas. Therefore, he intend to further extend support for to increase the plantation.

Tree Conservation:

With the help of Manavlok , Aurangabad-based Jan Sahayog Charitable Multi-Purpose Organization, has started tree conservation work at Camp Council Aurangabad. The Organization conserved more than 20,000 trees in this area.

Climate Resilience and Efficient Water Use in Cotton Crop (TNC):

The organization received approval for “Climate resilience and Efficient Water Use in Cotton Crop” project from The Nature Conservancy India (TNC India), New Delhi. The impact of climate change is clearly felt everywhere and having a direct effect on agriculture and rural life. The result is increasing suicide of farmers. Many researchers are saying that Marathwada is getting desertified. To prevail this, it is necessary to take long-term and sustainable measures.



As a part of this, Marathwada Navnirman Lokayat (Manavlok) in collaboration with the Nature Conservancy India (TNC India) a pilot project on “climate resilience and efficient use of water in cotton crop” is being implemented in Pathan Mandwa, Yelda, Mamdapur Parli in Ambajogai block and Bodhgaon and Moha in Parli block in beed district.

Although the project is limited to a short period of time, it is an experimental initiative with the long-term objective of restoring biodiversity and water management.

The following Interventions have been completed under this project:

Direct beneficiaries - : 75

Indirect beneficiaries - : 300

Total beneficiaries - : 375

- Afforestation on catchment areas: 1500 Trees
- Shivansh Compost: 05 Demo's (Organic Manure Produced with the help of agriculture waste material)
- Exposure visit: 01 (Participated by 39 farmers)
- Community Meetings: 10
- Community Awareness Programs: 05
- Capacity building workshops for project staff: 02
- Capacity building trainings to local organizations: 01 (Participated by 49 village representatives)

As a result of Drip irrigation out of 75 beneficiaries, 20 farmers got more than 25 thousand rupees, 11 farmers got 20 to 25 thousand, 16 farmers got 15 to 20 thousand, 14 farmers got 10 to 15 thousand, 12 farmers got 5 to 10 thousand and 22 farmers got less than 5 thousand as a profit. On an average Rs. 19,117 is the benefit to farmers.

Custard Apple Plantation Project:

Even though the world is under lockdown due to COVID-19, farmers are exceptional who are working in the fields taking care of others and themselves by following COVID community guidelines. Though world calls off farmers are always on duty. Manavlok is continuously implementing new activities to increase agricultural productivity and farmers' income. Through Custard Apple Plantation initiative, Manavlok is always at the forefront in helping them with crop selection, there planning, weather, market. One such dry land custard apple plantation project was decided to be implemented in Palaskheda village in kaj block of beed district.

For this Manavlok received support from FanKind, Mumbai.

In order to implement this project, farmers were interviewed to understand their participation and interest in this program and 44 farmers were selected for a total of 44 acres of agriculture,

one acre each. These farmers were supported for cultivation techniques, plants and drip sets for the plantation of custard apple using modern techniques.



Agricultural Reform Project:

Shri. Madhukar Rambhau Kale has been given Manavlok Bhavthana sub centre farmland for farming on a profit sharing basis. Manavlok received Rs. 11,000 per annum for the same.



Exposure Visits/Study Tour:

19 volunteers of Manavlok Participated the '**Krushik 2021**' agricultural exhibition held at Baramati Dist. Pune. Volunteers were sent to exhibition with the aim of making the volunteers aware of agriculture and agricultural technology, as well as various agricultural useful and agricultural supplementary materials and businesses like tractors, ploughs, threshers, sugar cane harvesters, goat rearing technology, information of Shed net, Fisheries etc.

'Watershed development work and Guava tree plantation project' :

A visit was made to the watershed development work and Guava tree plantation project implemented at Dhanora village in Ambajogai block. 15 volunteers were sent by Manavlok to visit the area. Gram Sevak Sunil Mamdage presented information about the various activities implemented by the village through Audio visuals.

Student to experimental farmer:

Mr. Ravindra Dewarwade of Devla village, Alumni of Manavlok's MSW College and volunteering in various activities of Manavlok, put forward the goal of doing farming after MSW. In order to change the agriculture practices due to lack of water for agriculture, ravindra learned information about watermelon cultivation and technical information in training organized by Manavlok. Under the guidance of Agri Assistant Mr. Magade, he planted yellow watermelon in his farm.

For his enterprising Step, He is being identified as an 'experimental modern farmer' as he changed cropping pattern to yellow watermelon. Ravindra invested Rs. 1 lakhs for plantation and earned 2 lakh rupees from selling out the watermelons.



Ranbhaji Mohatsav :

The essence of wild vegetables is something else; the new generation should know very little about it and rarely tasted. Its medicinal properties, nutrients, nutrition, increase the immunity of the human body. In order to re-identify all of them, to get to know the farmers who supply them, to create their supply chain and to reap the benefits of all of them again and again, '**Ranbhaji Mohatsav**' was organized on 9th Aug 2020 by Manavlok in association with Atma Beed. 27 different Vegetable stalls were set up for this festival.





05 Health services and Covid 19 related work



Community action for health is a project that focuses on “The right to health and creating awareness among the people about implementing a participatory process in health service delivery for the people by the people”. The objectives of Community Action for Health project are:

- (1) To create awareness among the community about people's rights and responsibilities in National health mission
- (2) To create opportunities for people's participation in decision making at various levels so that the public health services under National health mission are people-centred and accessible to all citizens. It also aims to create a feeling of ownership, responsibility and accountability among the people/ community.
- (3) To build a community/society that is ready to take responsibility, has a feeling of commitment for towards social good and for protecting rights of all individuals. It also aims to create leadership from the community to implement and monitor public health services.



There are Arogyavardhini Centres under this initiative. The participants visited 54 centres in Beed district to understand the issues and problems faced by people to access services under National Health Mission, in Beed district. Manavlok workers distributed pamphlets in the villages under the project. These pamphlets provided information about community-based action, appointment of village level Arogya-doot and about services provided at Arogyavardhini centres.

The Arogya-doots were appointed in 37 villages out of 45 in Beed district and in 32 villages out of 35 in Ambajogai block.

The Primary health centre “committee” was created in 5 PHCs in Ambajogai and 5 PHCs in Beed district. The committee members were provided basic training about their role and responsibility. The meetings of “Patient welfare committees” in Ambajogai block were conducted.



To create a district level “Action and Resource group” Manavlok representatives has a meeting with Arogya Sabhapati and President of ZP and informed them about community-based action process. The district Action and resource group visited primary health centres in Sangav, Bhavthana, Yelambghat, Ujani, Kesapuri-Parbhani, Talegaon and Manjarsumbha. On 8th March 2021 a meeting was conducted at Panchayat Samiti hall, Ambajogai this meeting was attended by the Block development officer Ambajogai, block Medical officer, Community medical officer, and Gram Sevaks to discuss the provisions under 15th Finance Commission and Arogyavardhini centres.

Saathi, Pune is supporting and partnering with Manavlok to implement this project from January 2021. State level trainings were organised for workers to introduce them to “community-based processes” on 8th January, 5th and 23rd March 2021.

Manavlok organised an orientation training for 7 workers from Ambajogai and Beed on 11th January 2021 for implementing the project. A block level training for community workers was organised on 1st February 2021. 10 workers participated in this training about “Community-based Action and Processes”. On 14th January 2021,

On 30th January 2021 a meeting with district medical officer in his office was organised. During this meeting Manavlok representatives informed district medical officer about this project. They shared their expectations from the district health department and the support needed from the district medical officer for effective and impactful implementation of this project. On 3rd March 2021, similar meeting was conducted with CEO and Deputy CEO, (PRI) to inform them about the project and also about their support required for effective implementation of the project.



On 11th Feb 2021, a one-day orientation -training was conducted at Manavlok Head office for members of Resource group, Medical officers and Community health officers, sabhapati, deputy Sabhapati, medical officers of PHCs in Ambajogai block and Accountant of BCM office. In total 58 persons attended this training.

On 12 Feb 2021 similar one-day training was organised at Dhanvantari Hall, District hospital, Beed. Total 70 persons including the District Medical officer, members of resource group, medical officers of PHCs in Beed district, collector and deputy collector Beed district attended this training.

5-1 Treatment and care

Previous year, Manavlok had donated a Dialysis machine to Swami Ramanand Tirth Rural Hospital and Medical college, Ambajogai, for the benefit of needy patients. This year the machine was used to provide free treatment to 30 patients, through 906 cycles. This saved INR.1812000/- of the needy patients.

Similarly, Manavlok had donated a Sonography machine to Swami Ramanand Tirth Rural Hospital and Medical college, Ambajogai, for the benefit of needy patients. Free sonography was provided to 15182 patients and the amount saved by patients is INR. 75,91000/-



Manavlok provided financial support of total INR 45000/- to 5 patients in their critical illness. The organisation provided items like walker, bed and other medical equipment on minimal rent to poor patients and senior citizens. Three patients took benefit of this. They also returned the items when their need was over. Considering their response Manavlok has plans to expand this service.

5: 2 Doctor at the doorstep

Due to Covid 19 pandemic lockdown Manavlok implemented “Doctor at the doorstep” project, in 5 villages in Ambajogai block. A Dispenser- van, visited the villages with a team of doctors. The doctors checked people suffering from various illnesses, and medicines were distributed. Bharatiya Jain Sanghatana and Force Motors supported this project. Rotary club provided medicines.



Manavlok provided financial support of total INR 45000/- to 5 patients in their critical illness. The organisation provided items like walker, bed and other medical equipment on minimal rent to poor patients and senior citizens. Three patients took benefit of this. They also returned the items when their need was over. Considering their response Manavlok has plans to expand this service.

5: 3 Distribution of artificial limbs and callipers to differently abled individuals



This project aims at providing artificial limbs and callipers to differently abled individuals, who have lost their limbs in a mishap or accident. The project aims to help them begin their life again. To pay respect to the work of Dr. Dwarkadas Lohiya, Founder, Manavlok, with support from Ratna Nidhi Charitable Trust, a camp was organised during 23rd to 26th November 2020. More than 500 differently abled individuals registered during this camp. The measurements of 289 persons were taken and they were provided with artificial limbs.

06 Education and Training

6: 1 Manavlok College of Social Work, Ambajogai

For academic year 2020-21 due to covid-19 pandemic the candidates filled their applications online for admission in the first year of social Work. In total 212 students submitted the online applications. 44 students (XX male and XX female) were provided admission in the first year of MSW. The admissions were given on Merit basis considering their graduation results.

The MSW college staff collected INR 200000/- to provide Ration Kits to financially backward/needy families.

On 1st April 2020, Professor Sukeshini Jogdand donated ration kits to 13 families residing in Ambejogai. The alumni organisation provided ration kits to 225 needy families residing in 12 villages. Principal Dr. Prakash Jadhav and Dr. Hanumant Unke were present on this occasion.

The MSW college staff participated in 29 national and international workshops and consultations during covid-19 period.

During reporting period 3 lecturers from the Social work college attended refreshers course relevant to their subject. The book titled “Gendering Violence” written by Dr Arundhati Patil and a book titled “Rural development schemes and programmes” by Dr Rama Pandey were published during reporting period.

Under the XXXX program the college academic council/ committee interviewed Dr Rama Pandey and Professor Kishan Shingare on 22nd December 2020 and Dr Arundhati Patil and Dr Nazeer Sheikh on 6th February 2021.

A meeting to discuss “plasma donation” secretary Manavlok and Dr. Prakash Jadhav, Dr. Nazeer Sheikh Dr Rama Pandey, Dr. Hanumant was arranged on 6th October 2020. Following this meeting a list of patients recovered from covid-19 was collected from the office of the Block medical officer. Out of the recovered patients 42 people were contacted for plasma donation and 3 people did plasma donation.

Social Lab and Environmental Solutions private limited Pune conducted campus interviews in Social work college, Ambajogai. They interviewed candidates for the positions of 5 coordinators and 25 field coordinators. Social Lab and Environmental Solutions private limited is in the business of Urban Solid Waste Management, providing services to Nagar Parishads, Nagar Panchayats and Mahanagar Palika areas. 115 candidates appeared for the interviews and 8 were selected for the job.

6: 2 Toy Bank

Manavlok in collaboration with Toy Bank Mumbai is implementing a program to encourage children to take interest in school education and to prevent drop outs in villages. The programme also aims at providing opportunity for intellectual, mental and physical development of children through games and activities. This program is being implemented in 39 schools, and 4552 students attended the program. Similar program in collaboration with Toy Bank is being implemented in 15 preschools/ anganwadis in Ambajogai block. 1077 students are attending these 15 Anganwadis. During the reporting period 6 new schools have shown interest in implementing this program. During Covid-19 pandemic the Games and Activities with children were conducted online.



6.3 : Child Line

Manavlok is the Nodal agency for Beed district in implementing Child line programs. During covid-19 pandemic the Child line conducted online training on POSCO law and Child Marriage Act. The team met police inspector Harsh Poddar and discussed the issues of preventing child marriages as well as registering complaints about the same. In a Safipur village in Beed district, one child marriage was prevented by meeting district collector to intervene and take action.

During lockdown, Manavlok intervened by providing ration to families belonging to nomadic tribals Pardhi community residing in Vasanwadi, outside Beed City. Manavlok also helped youth from Chandrapur migrated to Beed to go back to their native place during lockdown

Janshayog



Manavlok from the beginning believed in supporting the marginalised to take benefit of government schemes they are eligible for. Manavlok has a separate unit especially dedicated to enable the BPL (below poverty line) families to access the various government schemes and take benefit of the programmes to improve their socio-economic condition. Manavlok operates as a bridge between the marginalized families/individuals and the government departments. This unit provides guidance and support to the families residing in villages where Manavlok implements its development programmes.

Manavlok workers create awareness in the villages about government schemes and programs available for different categories of population. The BPL families and needy individuals are provided guidance in filling the application forms, accessing various certificates and do follow up with government departments until they get the benefit if they are eligible. On behalf of the citizens, Manavlok

wrote appeal letters to officers in charge of government departments to take necessary actions to provide people access to the services and benefits under various schemes/programmes. During the reporting period Manavlok wrote 11 appeal-letters to government departments. With the help of Manavlok 505 families/individuals received certificates such as Caste Certificate, Disability certificate etc. Under the guidance of Manavlok staff 455 applications for “Shravan Bal” scheme were made, out of which 200 were approved.

127 applications for “Sanjay Gandhi Niradhar Yojana” were submitted and 110 were approved. To seek help under “National family financial assistance scheme” 30 applications were made and 26 were approved. The staff also helped the families above poverty line and below poverty line to get ration cards. 79 families above poverty line applied for ration card and 48 families got the ration cards, whereas 58 families below poverty line applied for ration cards and 57 got the ration card. One family applied for change in ration card and it was approved

Manavlok provided food (two meals every day) to 20 mentally ill persons for 130 days during the lockdown. Manavlok raised INR 644750/- as donations and provided ration kits to 270 senior citizens. With the financial support from Shri Arun Asadohacker household items were gifted to one girl at the time of her marriage. The Secretary, Manavlok requested the Nagar Parishad to make the “Dharmashala” at Shivaji chowk Ambajogai functional so that it can be used for good purpose. The Dharamshala was cleaned and made operational where 20 mentally ill persons were provided shelter during lockdown.

Shri Aniket Lohiya along with the reporters and office bearers representing all political parties met the Dean of Swami Ramanand Tirtha Rural Hospital and Medical College and requested to run the OPD two times every day during covid pandemic.

08 Manaswini Mahila Prakalp

Manaswini Mahila Project is an important arm of Manavlok. This project implements programs focusing on Empowerment of Girls and women. With financial support from “SWISSAID India” Manaswini Mahila Prakalpa is implementing a project named “Addressing Gender based Discrimination and Domestic Violence in Marathwada region of Maharashtra. This project is being implemented in 20 villages in Ambajogai block and 10 villages in Dharur block.

“Save Indian farms” is supporting Manavlok- Mmanasvini Mahila Prakalpa to provide livelihood opportunities to widows, deserted women and single women so that they can be economically independent. The “Save Indian farms” provided financial assistance to Manasvini Mahila prakalpa under its business motivation (Prerana) project to give training, guidance and financial assistance to 210 women.

As a result of covid-19 pandemic nation-wide lockdown was declared which resulted into loss of livelihood of daily wage earners. Considering the situation of widows deserted and single women, Manasvini Mahila Prakalpa with the financial help from “Caring friends” distributed INR 1000 each as emergency fund to 460 women from Ambajogai and Dharur blocks. Manavlok also distributed grocery kits to 250 women from 5 villages in Dharur block

With financial support from A T E Chandra Foundation, Manaswini Mahila Project distributed sanitary pads to 2500 adolescent girls and women from 35 villages under its project area. Along with the sanitary pads, awareness session on proper use of the Sanitary Pads and Menstrual Hygiene was conducted.

On the occasion of death anniversary of Dr Shaila Lohiya on 24th July 2020 a webinar was organised on the topic “Covid19 Pandemic and women's problems” Respected MLA Dr. Neelam Tai Gorhe talk about governments approach about women's issues. Professor Mangla Khivasara talked about “women working in un organised sector and as house maids”. Well known Psychiatrist Dr. Sachin Gore talked about Stress due to covid-19 pandemic. He also provided some guidance to reduce the anxiety and stress.

It is observed that due to covid-19 pandemic many child marriages are taking place. The CEO of Beed district entrusted the responsibility to prevent child marriages to Gram Sevak of the villages. Government is implementing Nirdhar Samanata Prakalpa in 28 villages. The notice board is displayed by the Gram Panchayat mentioning that “Child marriage prevention committee “is formed in the village to prevent child marriage” at important place.

“Self-awareness centre”- in the activities and events organised by this centre, 90 women and girls from 9 villages are participating regularly. As a skill development activity, mehendi classes were organised and 67 girls attended the classes.



During 25th November to 10th December, in 30 villages under the project area “Violence free fortnight” was celebrated and various programs based on the theme were organised for youth and general population. Essay competition for young girls and boys, poster exhibition to create awareness about child marriage and dowry was organised. Discussion session on the topic of “friendship, love, infatuation and dowry” were organised where

young girls and boys from the villages were encouraged to freely express their views. As part of the capacity building activity for village level workers and volunteers, short films on subjects such as child marriage, women's empowerment, gender equality were screened. After screening the films discussion sessions were conducted. Young girls and boys and other group members participated enthusiastically in this program.

On 28 October 2020 the representatives of SWISSAID, MS Kavita Gandhi, Sneha Girdhari and Sujit Verma talked with Dr Arundhati Patil in an online meeting. Village level workers of Manaswini Mahila project also attended this meeting. The SWISSAID team and Manavlok team discussed the support provided during the pandemic, reviewed the work accomplished and planned the future activities.

Manasvini Mahila Prakalpa provided financial support of INR 1930477/- to 802 beneficiaries for kitchen garden, farming, small businesses, purchasing fertilizers and seeds, distribution of grocery kits etc. Manasvini Mahila prakalpa discontinued work in two villages and added two new villages namely Kolpimpri and Chothewadi under the project.

The of birth anniversary of Krantijyoti Savitribai Phule was celebrated as “Girl child day” to welcome the birth of a girl in the family. On the occasion of Makar Sankranti get-together of women was arranged in eight villages. On the occasion of international women's day on 8th March 601 girls from 28 villages took oath that “they will not marry until they are 18 years complete”. A letter mentioning that the village head-Sarpanch, the Gram Sevak and Gram Panchayat and the committee to prevent child marriage will be responsible if



they are married before completing 18 years was handed over to The Sarpanch, Gramsevak and Committee members. During the reporting period 113 cases were registered in counselling centre out of which 46 cases were resolved at the counselling centre level, eight cases work registered in court, one child marriage was prevented, the court passed judgement of 25 cases and three women got.....

On 23rd November 2020, death anniversary of Dr Dwarkadas Lohiya, a book “Gendering Violence” written by Dr Arundhati Patil and a flipbook developed by Manaswini Mahila Project on Child Marriage was published in the presence of renowned writer and a force behind Kisan Putra Movement Shri Amar Habib and secretary Manavlok Shri Aniket Lohiya.

09 Trupti – Supporting the Seniors

Manavlok started the Trupti Community kitchen from the year xxxxx with the objective of providing two wholesome meals every day to the needy seniors living in the villages.

Currently this initiative is implemented in 30 villages in project area. Two meals on daily basis are provided to 417 senior citizens across 30 villages. Manavlok collected donation of INR 4,09416/- to run the kitchens and to provide few essential items to needy seniors. Manavlok distributed 455 blankets, 45 Solar lanterns and 150 tiffin boxes under Trupti project. During Diwali festival 506 seniors were gifted Diwali sweets.

The organisation supported seven kitchen operators by providing fridge, seven kitchen operators were provided flour mill and two were provided with cupboards. The kitchen operators will repay the amount to Manavlok on instalments.

Two meetings with kitchen operators and two meetings of management committee were organised to discuss operational and other issues regarding running of the kitchens.

11 Vehicle Department

Manavlok owns 8 four wheelers, 6 two wheelers, 2 tractors, 9 tractor supported farm machines (2 trolley, plough, mogda, rotavator, laser land leveler, boom spray, 2 sowing machines) and 10 JCB machines. The repair and maintenance expenses for the year was INR 318589/ and for diesel INR 830404.25/- (excluding JCB and Harvester). The rent earned is INR 71902/- During the reporting period 7 JCB machines, 1 harvester and 1 grandee jeep was auctioned.



12 Stores Department

Manavlok purchased required equipment, machinery and other items during reporting period and the expenses was INR 13190700.09/- This amount includes the money spent for purchasing Grocery, Masks, Sanitizers, Medicines etc. for distribution during Covid 19 pandemic.

13 Income from other sources within organisation

Manavlok earned INR 1734195.88/- from its various income sources including farm, marriage hall, training centre, renting machinery and vehicles, projector, Xerox etc. nised a series of lectures by eminent professionals from development and impact sector.

On 1st April 2020 due to covid-19 pandemic, the Foundation day of Manavlok was celebrated in a very simple manner. Complete lockdown was announced all over India and there were restrictions on number of persons for meetings and gatherings. The Foundation day of Manavlok was celebrated in the presence of Secretary of Manavlok, Aniket Lohiya and a few workers from Manavlok

◆ In memory of Dr. Shaila Lohiya,

On the occasion of the death anniversary of Dr Shaila Lohiya on 24th July 2000 a webinar was arranged. The topic of the webinar was “Corona pandemic and women's issues”. Dr. Nilamtai Gorhe, MLA Vidhan Parishad, State of Maharashtra talked about the governments approach in handling women's issues, Prof. Mangala Khivasara talked about “Problems faced by women working as house maids and women working in unorganised sector”, Dr. Sachin Gore, eminent psychiatrist talked about the anxiety and mental health issues during covid-19 and the ways to handle them. Dr Arundhati Patil coordinator Manasvini Mahila Prakalp was the moderator for this webinar. 340 people including (118 young boys, 58 men, 122 young girls and 42 women) participated in this webinar.

On 10th August 2020, a webinar on “Child marriage and Sexual abuse of children” was organised. This webinar was specially arranged for village level workers and young girls and boys. Advocate Anita Gaurav and advocate Sanjay Singer talked about Child Marriage prevention Act and the amendments in this act. They also discussed about measures for effective implementation of Child Marriage Prevention Act. Dr Arundhati Patil was the moderator of this webinar. 329 persons including 104 young boys, 94 men, 98 young girls and 33 women participated in this webinar

On 8th October 2020 a webinar was organised for youth from rural areas. The topic of this webinar was “Livelihood opportunities through skill development”. Shri Sachin Chandurkar, Shri Vijay Kedar from Pratham Education Foundation, Mumbai provided guidance in this webinar. Shri Balaji Waghmare was the moderator of this session. Total 307 people including 156 young boys, 38 men, 87 young girls and 26 women participated in this webinar.

On the occasion of international women's day on 8th March 2021 a webinar on the subject “Gender awareness for Gender equality” was organised by Manavlok. Shri Utpal Vanita Baburao, editor of a magazine “milun sarya janee” dedicated to create awareness about Gender issues, shared his views and experiences. 348 young boys and girls from 28 villages in Manavlok project areas participated in this webinar.

◆ Interventions during Covid-19 pandemic management

During the critical situation of covid-19 pandemic with the financial support from donors Manavlok provided “Central Oxygen and Suction Machine” for 30 beds to Swami Ramananda Tirtha government hospital and medical College. Manavlok donated 3095 masks, gloves and PPE kits for doctors and nurses.

Manavlok implemented few activities in Ambajogai city and rural areas

The needy families unable to purchase sanitizers were provided with sanitizers. Total 1950 litres sanitizer was distributed. Blood donation camps were organised and hundred volunteer blood donors were kept ready for emergency

Manavlok provided boom sprayer machine to Nagar Parishad Ambajogai, for sanitizing the areas in the city.

During the lockdown period Manavlok took care of mentally ill persons by providing them two meals for 132 days. The volunteers also looked after their cleanliness and hygiene.

Manavlok provided its ambulance to carry the patients during lockdown. The ambulance was provided free of charge to 1549 patients.

To protect and promote women's health during the pandemic, with the help from Living guard, Manavlok distributed hygienic, reusable Sanitary napkins to 2500 women from rural areas. The women were provided information about menstrual hygiene and guidance to use the sanitary napkins.



Manavlok workers motivated 52 women from Ambajogai City to stitch reusable Cloth Masks. As a result, they made 21000 Cloth masks, which were then distributed by Manavlok in Ambajogai city and nearby villages. This initiative provided livelihood to 52 women during lockdown. The seniors who were staying alone were unable to go to banks to collect their pension. With the intervention from Manavlok workers, the facility to give their pension at their doorsteps was arranged.



There were 200 single women farmers in villages across project area. They were stuck in the village due to lockdown. Manavlok provided them with seeds and fertilizers so that they can continue farming and there will be no loss of livelihood. Due to lockdown all businesses were stranded. This resulted into loss of income of construction workers, daily wage earners, farm labourers, labourers working in shops and generally persons working in unorganised sectors. Manavlok distributed 10000 kits containing grocery and basic hygiene items (sufficient for one month) to these workers in Ambajogai city and villages

across Ambajogai block. Manavlok took the responsibility and supported migrant labour by providing them food and shelter till the lockdown ended. 124 persons were accommodated in Manavlok main office campus, 24 sugarcane cutting workers were provided food and shelter in Dharur and 14 were accommodated in Yelda sub center.

The lockdown was announced without any prior information so 33 labour from Madhya Pradesh and 5 from Uttar Pradesh working in jinning factory at Bardapur in Ambejogai block started walking towards their native villages. The tahasildar

Ambajogai learnt about them and requested Manavlok to arrange accommodation and food for them till the end of lockdown. Manavlok provided accommodation and daily two meals to 38 migrant labourers for 25 days. Manavlok provided food to 429 senior citizens from 25 villages during lockdown. The organisation also provided Grocery to the Bhakti Prem senior home where 24 seniors are accommodated. Manavlok provided grocery and hygiene kits to 24 families from Dombari community, 24 families from dhangar (nomadic tribe) community and 40 families working on brick kiln near Ambajogai city.

Various organisations came forward to support Manavloks covid relief work. “India Fellow, Delhi” provided 1000 grocery kits for distribution to Manavlok. 5000 kits were provided.

Manavlok helped 10 students by helping them in reaching home. These students were walking to their native place in Gadchiroli district from Pune. Manavlok provided transport till their home to 38 labourers from jinning factory. They were from Madhya Pradesh and Uttar Pradesh. Manavlok helped one woman and her five children to go to Hingoli.



Manavlok had provided guidance to farmers to form a farmer producer company. During these challenging time Manavlok intervened and asked this company to regularly take fruits and vegetables to different residential localities in the city and in villages. During this time Manavlok organised webinars to create awareness, organised poster exhibitions to spread information to common people and also provided medical support whenever possible.



‘मानवलोक’चे अनिकेत लोहिया ‘जलयोद्धा’ पुरस्काराने सन्मानित

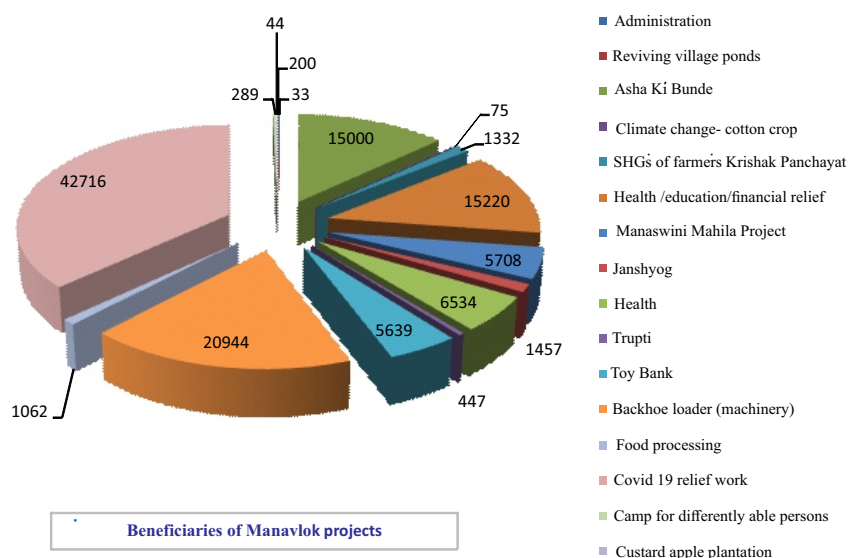
